



## THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

### Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 42:1–9

<sup>1</sup> Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights;  
I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations.  
<sup>2</sup> He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street;  
<sup>3</sup> a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice.  
<sup>4</sup> He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law.  
<sup>5</sup> Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it:  
<sup>6</sup> "I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations,  
<sup>7</sup> to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.  
<sup>8</sup> I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to carved idols.  
<sup>9</sup> Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."


### Epistle: Romans 6:1–11

<sup>1</sup> What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup> We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup> We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup> So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

### Holy Gospel: Matthew 3:13–17

<sup>13</sup> Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. <sup>14</sup> John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" <sup>15</sup> But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. <sup>16</sup> And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; <sup>17</sup> and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

**Opening Hymn Sovereign Ruler of the Skies (tune LSB 783)**

1. Sovereign Ruler of the Skies, Ever gracious, ever wise,  
All my times are in your hand, All events at your command.

### **Confession – Absolution Psalm 139**

**P: O Lord, you have searched me and known me!**

**C: You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar.**

**P: You search out my path and my lying down**

**C: and are acquainted with all my ways.**

**P: Even before a word is on my tongue,**

**C: behold, O Lord, you know it altogether.**

**P: You hem me in, behind and before,**

**C: and lay your hand upon me.**

**P: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me;**

**C: it is high; I cannot attain it.**

**P: Almighty and Everlasting God, Your understanding comprehends all things. You see how Your creatures have departed from Your wise design. You know the desires of all humankind have become entirely unrighteous. Our thoughts, words, and deeds worship us above You and serve self instead of one another. Yet Your Son has assumed our feeble nature and feels our weakness and need. For the sake of His sacrifice, remember us in mercy. Lay not Your hand of reckoning upon us and grant remission of all our sins.**

**C: Amen.**

**P: Where shall I go from your Spirit?**

**C: Or where shall I flee from your presence?**

**P: If I ascend to heaven, you are there!**

**C: If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!**

**P: If I take the wings of the morning**

**C: and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,**

**P: even there your hand shall lead me,**

**C: and your right hand shall hold me.**

**P: If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me,**

**C: and the light about me be night,"**

**P: even the darkness is not dark to you;**

**C: the night is bright as the day, for darkness is as light with you.**

**P: O Lord, our Heavenly Father, You pursue us in jealousy to the ends of the heavens and earth. We cannot flee from Your judgment nor hide from the punishments we**

deserve. But Your Son, our Savior Christ Jesus has traded our guilt in exchange for His glory. His death and resurrection have brought us the light of life everlasting. Drive our evils away from us with repentance, forgiveness, and faith, that we may behold Your goodness now and evermore.  
**C: Amen.**

**P:** For you formed my inward parts;  
**C: you knitted me together in my mother's womb.**  
**P:** I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.  
**C: Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well.**

**P:** My frame was not hidden from you,  
**C: When I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.**  
**P:** Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them,  
**C: the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them.**  
**P:** How precious to me are your thoughts, O God!  
**C: How vast is the sum of them!**  
**P:** If I would count them, they are more than the sand.  
**C: I awake , and I am still with you.**

**P:** Children of men, do not fear! Incarnate Christ Jesus has come among us, sharing both womb and world, plumb the depths of the earth, plundered death and the tomb. Take heart, for the Almighty Maker has created, redeemed, and called you His own. Upon your confession, in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen.**

**P:** Oh, that you would slay the wicked, O God!  
**C: O men of blood, depart from me!**  
**P:** They speak against you with malicious intent;  
**C: your enemies take your name in vain.**  
**P:** Do I not hate those who hate you, O Lord?  
**C: and do I not loathe those who rise up against you?**  
**P:** I hate them with complete hatred;  
**C: I count them my enemies.**  
**P:** Search me , O God, and know my heart!  
**C: Try me and know my thoughts!**  
**P:** And see if there be any grievous way in me,  
**C: and lead me in the way everlasting!**

**C: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.**

**P:** Lord God, our Father and Savior, open our hearts to receive and delight in Your wonders. Open our lips to rejoice and proclaim all Your works. Strengthen us in flesh and spirit to refuse wickedness and replace the lust for control with Your own truth and love. Give us courage to rescue the vulnerable and compassion to relieve the victim that together we may share Your life.
